HOTEL SAFETY TIPS



At check-in, notify the hotel of any registered guests to your room, and **ask that no one else receives a key**



Discard the card sleeve or folio the front desk gives you, which usually has your room number on it



Do not share your room number with anyone you meet (at the hotel bar or elsewhere)



If you lose your key, make sure to report this to the hotel, and specifically ask the hotel staff to disable the old key before providing a new one



When you're in your room, **always use the deadbolt** and/or the chain lock



Don't leave your purse, suitcase or other belongings **unattended**



WHAT TO DO AFTER AN ASSAULT OR ATTACK AT A HOTEL



Immediately **call 911**, and report the assault to law enforcement



If sexually assaulted, **locate a clinic or hospital** that performs rape kits, and immediately go in for an examination and evidence collection



Report the assault to the hotel's management



Ask the hotel to **preserve all video** surveillance footage from the day of the assault



Keep your hotel room key and any reservation confirmation materials



Contact a sexual assault attorney to **learn about your legal rights**
